Baby Flamingos: Flamingo chicks are born with gray or white feathers, not pink!

Pink Coloration: Flamingos get their pink color from their diet. They eat tiny creatures like shrimp and algae that contain carotenoids, which turn their feathers pink.

Size: The greater flamingo, the largest species, can grow up to 4.7 feet (1.4 meters) tall.

Waterproof Feathers: Flamingos produce a special oil that they spread over their feathers to make them waterproof.

Flamingo Ears: Their ears are hidden under their feathers. They don't have external ear structures like mammals do.

Leg Bending: When flamingos appear to bend their legs backwards, it's actually their ankle joint bending. Their knee is higher up and hidden by feathers.

Lifespan: In the wild, flamingos typically live 25-30 years. In captivity, they can live up to 50 years or more.

Feet: Flamingos have webbed feet, which help them swim and walk in muddy waters.

Species: There are six species of flamingos in the world.

Diet: Flamingos eat tiny shrimp, algae, and other small water creatures rich in carotenoids.

Flamingo Pose: Flamingos often stand on one leg. This helps them conserve body heat and energy.

Upside-Down Eating: Flamingos feed with their heads upside down in the water. Their bills are specially adapted to filter food from the water.

Flocking: Flamingos are very social birds. They can live in flocks of thousands or even millions!

Flamingo "Milk": Both male and female flamingos

produce a nutrient-rich liquid called crop milk to feed their chicks.

Flying Flamingos: Despite their awkward appearance, flamingos are excellent flyers and can travel up to 35 miles per hour (56 km/h).

Salty Diet: Flamingos can drink water that's almost as salty as seawater. They have special glands that remove salt from their bodies.

Ancient Birds: Flamingos have been around for a long time. Fossil evidence suggests they existed over 30 million years ago!

Voice: Flamingos make a variety of sounds, from grunting and growling to honking, similar to geese.

Nesting: Flamingos build mud nests that look like little volcanoes to lay their eggs in.

Cultural Significance: Flamingos have been featured in art and culture for thousands of years, from ancient Egyptian hieroglyphics to modern lawn ornaments.


